## **SUNDAY—APRIL 11**

Edward Everett, American statesman and orator, was born on April 11, 1794; he, too, spoke at Gettysburg, but is not the address that is remembered....Charles Evans Hughes, also born on this date (1862) served in his career as Secretary of State and Chief Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court; an historical footnote: he was the last major presidential candidate who had a beard....Irish politician Sir Boyle Roche, born on April 11, 1743, is best remembered for this mixture of metaphors which he used in a speech delivered in Parliament: "Mister speaker, I smell a rat; I see him forming in the air and darkening the sky; but I will nip him in the bud."
