SUNDAY—APRIL 18

A little after 5am on April 18, 1906, most of San Francisco, CA, was destroyed by an earthquake that registered 8.3 on the Richter scale... The midnight ride of Paul Revere took place on April 18, 1775... American lawyer Clarence Darrow, born on April 18, 1857, is remembered for his courtroom battle with William Jennings Bryan in the 1925 Scopes revolution trial in Dayton, Tennessee; upon the election of Warren G. Harding as president, Darrow commented, When I was a boy, I was told anyone could become president; now I believe it."... The first baseball game in Yankee Stadium was played on this date in 1923; Babe Ruth was in right field for the home team, the New York Yankees.

TODAY'S LITURGY

We continue our Easter season celebration today with readings that clearly point us to the evangelizing mission of the Church. The witness of the apostles in spite of persecution is only one example of the imperative to spread the Good News.
