SUNDAY—MAY 02

On May 2 falls the anniversaries of two events in Russian history: the Empress Catherine II was born (1729), and the Nazis surrendered Berlin to the Russian Army (1945)...English dramatist and essayist Jerome K. Jerome was born on May 2, 1859; he once observed, "It is impossible to enjoy idling unless one has plenty of work to do."...Also born today (1903) was Dr. Benjamin Spock whose book of advice on baby care sold millions of copies; however, in a candid moment, he acknowledged, "The more people have studied different methods of bringing up children, the more they have come to the conclusion that what good mothers and fathers instinctively feel like doing for their babies is usually best after all."
