SUNDAY—MAY 23

On May 23, 1622, Nicholas Brown and Thomas Archer published the first issue of THE WEEKLY NEWS, Great Britain's first regular weekly newspaper....English poet Thomas Hood, born in London on May 23, 1799, once wrote: "When we are upon the first of men/The apple pressed, with spurious can't/Or what a thousand bites then/That Adam was not adamant/....American essayist Margaret Fuller, born on May 23, 1810, made this point in her WOMEN IN THE NINETEETH CENTURY: "What a woman needs is not as a woman to act or rule, but as a native to grow, as an intellect to discern, as a soul to live freely and unimpeded, to unfold such powers as were given her."
