SUNDAY—JUNE 06

TODAY'S LITURGY

Every Sunday we gather at God's gracious invitation to be nourished in the Eucharist. Today in particular, we call to mind this memorial handed down to us through the ages. Indeed, we hear today of an even more ancient tradition of meal sharing in the first reading. But the meal that we share today is Christ's very Body and Blood, given to us on Calvary and made present every time we do what he commanded us to do at this altar. May our prayer today be one of thanksgiving for this great gift of the Eucharist.

After feeding the people in today's gospel there were twelve baskets of leftovers. Leftovers are common in our homes and if we keep them too long they turn bad. "Emotional leftovers" such as resentment, jealousy and unresolved conflict in our family also become toxic when held too long. Do some spring cleaning and toss out your emotional leftovers.
