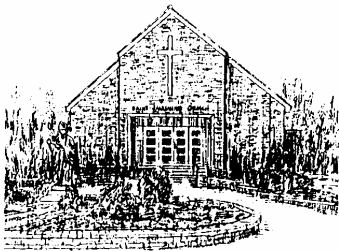

## **SUNDAY—JUNE 13**

French philosopher Etienne Gilson was born in Paris on June 13, 1884; in his study *THE SPIRIT OF MEDIEVAL PHILOSOPHY*, he described love: “But to love is quite another thing; it is to will an object for itself, to rejoice in its beauty and goodness for themselves, and without respect for anything other than itself.”... American poet Mark Van Dover, born today (1894), also mused about love: “The world is hard to love, though we must love it because we have no other, and to fail to love it is not to exist at all.”... Alexander the Great died on June 13, 323 B.C.... On June 13, 1967, the late Thurgood Marshall was appointed the first African American justice of the U.S. Supreme Court.
