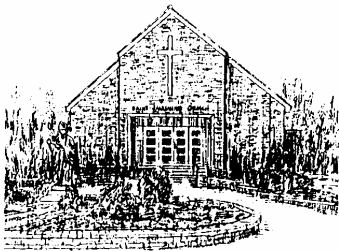

## **SUNDAY—JULY 04**

The United States of America came into existence on July 4, 1776. Some famous Americans have entered this world or left it on that anniversary date, to wit: Calvin Coolidge, the 27th president, was born on July 4, 1874; Composer Stephen Foster was born on July 4, 1826, the very same day on which occurred the deaths of both John Adams, the 2nd president and Thomas Jefferson, the 3rd president; Novelist Nathaniel Hawthorne was born on July 4, 1894; James Monroe, the 5th president, died on July 4, 1831; American poet Alan Seegar was killed in action in France on July 4, 1918.

## **TODAY'S LITURGY**

After a couple of weeks of hearing about the demands of discipleship, today's first reading of comfort is welcome indeed. As the disciples are sent out in today's Gospel, so are we sent out to spread the Good News. And we know that God will support us and give us what we need for the mission that we undertake in Jesus' name. So let us pray that in this Eucharist we will open our hearts once again to God doing new things in and through us.

## **FAMILY PERSPECTIVE**

The gospel today is clear: Peace comes to a "household if a peaceful person lives there," Peace starts with your ability to forgive, to correct without attacking, to accept the ways of others and to recognize a different opinion is not a personal rejection. It is actually your own peace which you give to your family. In today's gospel the apostles were giddy with their new POWER ("Even the demons obey us!"). On this July 4th weekend, Jesus cautions power is easily misused to dominate or manipulate others. True power is meant to "free captives," especially those handcuffed by grief, chained to unresolved conflict, jailed inside a timid personality or imprisoned by illness.
