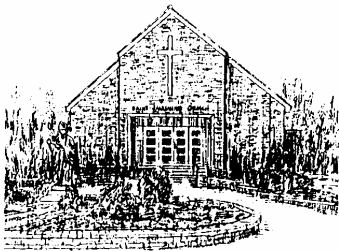

SUNDAY—JULY 11

American journalist and critic E.B. White was born on July 11, 1899; he is fondly remembered as the author of the children's story CHARLOTTE'S WEB, and he had this to say about the printed word: "Reading is the work of an alert mind, is demanding, and under ideal circumstances produces finally a sort of ecstacy. This gives the experience of reading a sublimity and power unequalled by any other form of communication."...French essayist and novelist Leon Bloy was born in the Dorodogne region of France on July 11, 1846; he once wrote, "Anti-Semitism, is the most horrible slap in the face suffered in the ever-continuing passion of our Lord."
