FEASTS AND EVENTS:

- Sunday: Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time; St. Dominic, priest and founder of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans) (1170-1221); Bishop Benedict Joseph Flaget consecrates the first cathedral in the West, St. Joseph Cathedral in Bardstown, KY, 1819.
- Monday: St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein), gassed at Auschwitz, 1942; Franz Jagerstatter beheaded, 1943; Atomic bomb dropped in Nagasaki, 1945; Bartholome Navanjo, a Native American, is slain for refusing to take part in the Great Pueblo Revolt against the Spanish missionaries, 1680.
- Tuesday: St. Lawrence, deacon & martyr (died 258); 21 Franciscan Friars are slain in New Mexico's missions, 1680; Congress charts the Smithsonian Institution, 1846; National Military Establishment renamed Department of Defence, 1949.
- Wednesday: St. Clare, virgin & founder of the Poor Clares (Franciscans), (1194-1253); John Henry Newman died, 1890; Mob burns down the Ursuline nuns convent in Charlestown, MA, 1834.
- Thursday: St. Jane Frances de Chantal, religious (1572-1641).
- Friday: St. Pontian, pope & martyr (died 235); St. Hippolytus, priest & martyr (died 235); Berlin Wall completed, 1961.
- Saturday: St. Maximilian Kolbe, priest & martyr, put to death in Auschwitz, 1944; Social Security Act passed by Congress, 1935; Unconditional Surrender of Japan ending World War II, 1945
