James Keir Hardie, a founder of the British Labor Party, was born August 15, 1856, in Scotland; he went to work in a coal mine at the age of 11 and remarked later in his life, “I am of the unfortunate class who never knew what it was to be a child in spirit. Even the memories of boyhood and young manhood are gloomy.”...American novelist Edna Farber, born August 15, 1887, in Michigan, observed in her *A KIND OF MAGIC*, “There is an interesting resemblance in the speech of dictators, no matter what country they hail from or what language they speak.”...Coincidentally enough, today is the birthdate (1769) of Napoleon Bonaparte.

TODAY’S LITURGY

In Mary’s assumption we see the victory that God has in mind for all who believe in Jesus Christ. Each reading today is a victory cry: In the Gospel Mary “proclaims the greatness of the Lord”; St. Paul announces that “in Christ shall all be brought to life”; and in the reading from Revelation the Son is glorified with the proclamation, “Now have salvation and power come, and the kingdom of our God.” Christ has won for us the victory over sin and death. Let us pray for the grace to receive the precious gift, as Mary before us has done.

“Blessed is the fruit of your womb” can be said to all mothers, because every child is “blessed” and a child of God upon whom God “looks with favor.” We cannot earn this blessing & God’s love is a free gift to each of us. This is our deepest identity and destiny.
