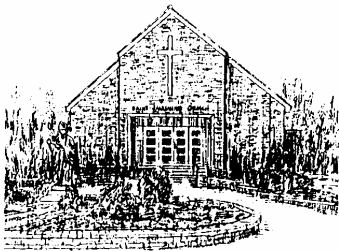

**FEASTS AND EVENTS:**

- Sunday: Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time; THE BOSTON PILOT, oldest existing diocesan newspaper, is launched, 1829; the first Continental Congress assembles in Philadelphia, 1774..
- Monday: Labor Day: Blessings of Human Labor; Jane Addams born, 1860; Jesuit priests open St. Ignatius College (now John Carroll University) in Cleveland, 1886.
- Wednesday: Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary; Our Lady of Charity (Cuba); a Spanish expedition established the first permanent European settlement in North America at what is now St. Augustine, Florida, 1565; Father Pedro Menenday de Aviles founds the first parish in the United States at St. Augustine, Florida, 1565.
- Thursday: St. Peter Claver, priest & missionary (1581-1654); African-American bishops issue pastoral letter on evangelization "What We Have Seen and Heard", 1984; Roy W. Wilkins, worker for racial justice, died, 1981; first iron-hulled US Navy ship, the gunboat USS MICHIGAN, authorized by Congress, 1841; Rosh Hasanah (Jewish New Year 5771).
- Friday: Jesuit Father Alexander Diomedi buys a printing press to publish catechisms for Pacific Northwest tribes, 1874.
- Saturday: Jesuits found Los Angeles College, now Loyola Marymont University, 1911.

## **SUNDAY—SEPTEMBER 05**
